Voces Inocentes (Innocent Voices) tells a very personal story wrapped within a larger political context. Based on the memoirs of co-writer, Oscar Orlando Torres, the film takes the audience back to the 1980's during the brutal civil war that devastated El Salvador. Much like in many Central and South American battles, the struggle involved an authoritarian regime fighting against communist guerillas. Atrocities were documented on both sides, and the war lasted for a dozen years, ending in 1992 when both sides signed a U.Nsponsored peace treaty. For Voces Inocentes, however, politics represents background. This is the story of one brave child's harrowing ordeal surviving a war while trying to protect all of the people he loved. Among others, Voces Inocentes has won the Audience Choice Award for Dramatic Feature at the 2005 Heartland Film Festival, as well the Stanley Kramer Award of the Producers Guild of America.
