

A reflexive verb is a verb in which the **action** of the verb **reflects** back onto the **subject**.

In other words: The **doer** of the action (verb) and the direct **object** (the receiver of the action) are the **same**.

-ar reflexive verbs

relajarse
quedarse

-ir reflexive verbs (e → ie)

divertirse

- In Spanish, the infinitive of reflexive verbs has **se** attached to the end of them to identify that they are a reflexive verb.
- The “-se” changes according to the **subject** of the verb.

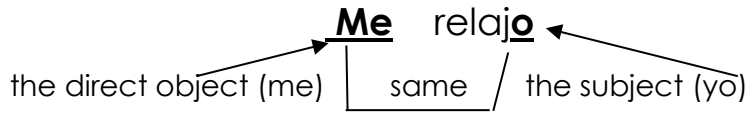

To conjugate a reflexive verb:

- When you conjugate a reflexive verb, you apply the same conjugation rules as non-reflexive verbs (-ar, -er, -ir, stem Δ ers, irregulars).

Formula: stem + ending

- When you conjugate a reflexive verb, the **REFLEXIVE PRONOUN** must agree with the subject and comes before the conjugated verb.

relajarse - to relax

yo	me	relajo	nosotros	nos	relajamos
tú	te	relajas	vosotros	os	relajáis
él, ella, usted	se	relaja	ellos, ellas, ustedes	se	relajan

quedarse - to stay, remain

yo	me	quedo	nosotros	nos	quedamos
tú	te	quedas	vosotros	os	quedáis
él, ella, usted	se	queda	ellos, ellas, ustedes	se	quedan

divertirse (e→ie) - _____

yo	me	divierto	nosotros	nos	divertimos
tú	te	diviertes	vosotros	os	divertís
él, ella, usted	se	divierte	ellos, ellas, ustedes	se	divierten
